








### President's Report

### **Centre Manager's Report**

Congratulations ECH Team on another amazing year ....!!

Thankyou to our dedicated Team of staff, volunteers and student placements who help us endlessly throughout the year. We could not achieve what we do without your support.

How exciting it is to finally be at the tail end of COVID19. In the July – December 2021 half, we have shared the highs and lows of continuing lockdowns and the anticipation of moving into 2022 possibly experiencing similar conditions. But in

reality, the hardest part has been the confidence of community to re-engage in programs and activities and begin to enjoy life again.

We have continued to see our numbers climb in terms of connections and demands from our community in various ways throughout 2022, but particularly in the area of food assistance and other material provisions, effectively now tripling the amount of support we are providing to our citizens each month compared to 2018/19. This past year we have again surpassed our previous figure providing more than 1.5 million dollars in support to our Community based on our reporting to **Neighbourhood Houses Victoria and Department Families Fairness & Housing (DFFH).** 

We are sincerely grateful to our partners who provide us with ongoing support including **Bendigo Foodshare**, **Foodbank Victoria**, **the One Box**, **the Bendigo Community Health Services Coat Drive**, **St John of God**. Thankyou to the **Victorian Government (Jacinta Allan MP & Maree Edwards MP)** for awarding us more than \$27,500 from the Food Relief Funding Reserve in December 2021. This funding allowed us to purchase grocery and meat vouchers for distribution over the Christmas/New Year period helping more than 100 individuals and families. And to the **City of Greater Bendigo** for providing support towards the many, various projects we undertake. Additionally to Lisa Chesters MP for visiting our community for lunches and supporting our volunteers through grant funding.

We are thankful for the ongoing Safe Seats Safe Kids program hosted by Kidsafe Victoria partnering with NHVic and Victorian State Govt support providing free car seat restraint safety checks; the power saving bonus program offering eligible citizens a \$250 incentive due to the lockdowns and additional hours required to run appliances within homes.

And our partnerships continue to grow with Bendigo Family Financial Services providing financial advice and assistance and to Ruth Hosking's and COTA for connecting with our seniors and families to ensure they are registered with the My Aged Care program offering further support and reassurance for later in life.

This year we have also seen the final development of the **Community Food Pantry** – our website platform for people to engage seeking food assistance and support, allowing us to connect with individuals and families who may not have experienced hardship before including reduced working hours, unemployment and rising living costs.

Our regular programs have returned including Art classes, Tai Chi, Meditation, Community lunches. Additionally our inhouse activities including our Meal preparation program, magazine development, our community gardens are looking beautiful with fresh produce flourishing. We have also undertaken more than \$60,000 in new signage and landscaping work to ensure our gardens and grounds are accessible to all, easy maintenance and workable. A huge thankyou to **Property Home Improvements** for all your hard work, to **Bunnings Epsom** and the **Department of Justice** for your ongoing support.

Despite ongoing COVID19 issues we did manage to deliver an amazing Community Christmas party in late December 2021 in-between more lockdowns. This was a fabulous event well supported and

showed that our citizens were very much missing the social aspect of life. But one thing was assured, with a movie truck, santa visit with loads of presents kindly donated **from Bendigo Toyworld through** 

their yearly Community Toy Drive, lots of food and treats for everyone, the smiles and happiness was wonderful to see. Unfortunately however, we were unable to deliver the Eaglehawk Children's Festival again in 2021, but this time it was due to rain for 3 days prior to the event.

Although there were many diversions and distractions due to COVID19 in 2020/21, the time also allowed us to assess our priorities and after working very hard to secure funding to boost our more specialist and/or experienced staff, in April 2022 we began employing for positions including **Rochelle** as executive support and **Danni** our experienced cook to plan and prepare for our Community Café launch.

Again there were many highlights throughout the year with an invitation to meet Australia's **Governor General David Hurley & Mrs Linda Hurley** at a function to thank organizations for supporting their citizens throughout the COVID19 pandemic.

And again in May, I was invited to celebrate the **100**<sup>th</sup> **Anniversary of Foodbank Victoria** at Government House in Melbourne and to meet the **Governor Linda Dessau** once again.

And of course, the excitement of being announced the 2022 Bendigo Business Excellence Awards - Winners of the Not for Profit Community Impact Award. We have all worked incredibly hard in past years and it is incredibly rewarding to be recognized and acknowledged in this way. We thank the **BBEA judges, sponsors and connections** for making this fabulous program possible.

A massive thankyou also to our amazing staff and volunteer Team – President John, Sabine, Mel, Ally, Cindy, Brett, Chris, Adam, Danni, Narelle, Norm, John, Rachel, Rochelle, Glynn, Sim, Tatiana, Martin, Ash, Christian, Mark and Catherine. You are always so wonderful to have around. Nothing is ever too much for you. This Community is so enriched by your contributions every day.

Thankyou also to our marvellous Committee of Management. I appreciate the relationships I have with you all and thank goodness every day you are on our Team. You are always there to lend a hand, whether that be in the garden, at a BBQ, deliveries, fundraisers and/or events. Or whether I need your assistance or guidance with my own role.
