Tracey Meets The Governor

In early May, Centre Manager of the Eaglehawk & Kangaroo Flat Community Houses, Tracey Moss was invited by the Governor of Victoria The Honourable Linda Dessau AC to visit Government House in Melbourne to help celebrate Foodbank Victoria's 90th Anniversary and acknowledge they have stood by vulnerable Victorians, facilitating healthy food for all with dignity and respect.

Tracey's invitation was presented in recognition of her work addressing food insecurity in our region and acknowledges the partnership between Foodbank Victoria and the Eaglehawk Community House. This partnership has now progressed to include the Kangaroo Flat Community House. Jenny from Bendigo Family Financial Services also attended the celebration with Tracey. They are another local frontline Agency delivering great work.

Tracey says, "It is heartbreaking to understand that people in this modern era are going without food". Foodbank Victoria states that in 2021, one in six Australian adults did not have enough to eat.

Food insecurity doesn't just target the homeless or disadvantaged nor is there only one reason why people experience food insecurity. Food recipients are every day people who have simply fallen on hard times. Many are hard working people, most with families, farming communities hit by drought or other disasters, students who have relocated and trying to make ends meet. At Eaglehawk we are seeing a rise again this year in people needing our assistance many due to the hardship of current rising living costs such as homelessness, mortgages/rents, groceries, fuel, utilities, etc.

Neighbourhood & Community Houses have a very unique way of working with the people who seek our support. It's about welfare checks, connecting in a time of need, assisting through care and conversation, building relationships and ensuring people understand they are not alone.

We call it a 'hand up' – not a 'hand out'.

For the majority of people, seeking support is not ongoing. Very few faces do we see over and over and most often it's simply providing assistance to ease the pressure on someone's situation to allow them time to breath. But it is also important we have limits, to refer and connect people with major organizations who can provide a higher level of support. Bendigo Family Financial Services visit both the Kangaroo Flat Community House and the Eaglehawk Community House once every month and are available for appointments locally.

And in these ways, we hope to minimize those that fall through the cracks.

We can't assume people know where to go for support, especially food relief.

Sometimes people just don't know where to go simply because it's something they have not faced in life before. As Agencies, we need to get louder with our messages and we are working closely with our peak body Neighbourhood Houses Victoria, Government and local Council for increased awareness and support, particularly funding for equipment, storage facilities and ongoing costs. We can't afford to lose our Agencies on the frontline due to a lack of the essential supports we need to continue.

We also need to work on changing the views and understanding around food insecurity. Often it's the stigma that prevents someone from reaching out and seeking assistance. People feel there is someone worse off than them, that if they pay this next bill, they will be through the worst of it; that if they are successful with their latest job application submitted, things will be fine.

But, It's not just about handing out food and the support can't simply end there.

We have a responsibility to empower people, to share our knowledge and skills aiming for individuals to make appropriate food choices to improve their health and wellbeing.

Some people have never cooked a meal in their life and suddenly find themselves on their own. Others have no family, no friends or support networks around them. Many people need to learn what foods to seek or purchase and how to prepare it for eating.

At Eaglehawk, we are seeing a rise in the number of people connecting to volunteer. And the reason for this is because they have received assistance from us in the past and this is their way of giving back. But they also know that through their commitment they are in-turn assisting others that are in need of support, just like they may have been in the past.

At the Kangaroo Flat Community House we are also proactive in addressing the food insecurity within our Community. From mid June, fresh fruit and vegetables will be available weekly. We currently have beautiful warm coats, blankets and doonas and at times, we have some grocery supplies available. We have been busy in current months building our volunteer team to ensure our Food program is sustainable with capable assistance and fundraising planned to support the costs associated initially. Deaf Hub Bendigo now call Eaglehawk home. Having taken over management of the Senior Citizens Hall in Darling Street, they've been busy making improvements by adding IT and filming facilities, kitchen facilities and new amenities.

Deaf Hub Bendigo is a not-for-profit Deaf-lead community based organisation established in 2019, dedicated to education and reducing barriers. The organisation was previously based at Pepper Green Farm and has since grown to 80 plus members.

The Hub supports individuals and community to develop self-empowerment, reduce isolation and build community resilience by breaking down barriers. While making it their mission to create awareness across the Loddon Mallee and Regional Victorian hearing communities.

The Hub delivers workshops and information sessions in all aspects of life, education, health, community interest, art and individual skill building for deaf, hard of hearing, deafblind and CODA communities. As well as helping participants with technology updates for equipment.

Elise Stewart the CEO and founder of the Deaf Hub Bendigo and her team are changing lives for regional families who would otherwise have to travel to Melbourne to access the supports they need, and at times, this support can be very limited. The Deaf Hub provides programs and training that are peer lead, delivered by people who are deaf or H.O.H, deafblind and people with disabilities.

It gives children someone like them that they can look up to and a cultural sense of belonging. Mentorship and role modelling program's increase skills and confidence and its empowering participants to dream big and realise they can achieve amazing things.

"It's led by people who are locals and understand the struggles of living regionally. Being able to access supports without having to travel 2 ½ hours means that we can continue to live close to our family and provide the country life that we want for our children."

With local programs and events such as Deaf Awareness Training, fortnightly Community Dinners, Coffee Catch up and Camp's the hub is working hard to bridge gaps for families in their community.

"Ellie was a godsend. We've had meetings at Lily's school with the teachers and students about general deaf awareness and how to provide for Lily. Ellie has a real passion for helping the deaf community. I can't even imagine how we got on before being introduced to Ellie and the Deaf Hub community."

Lightning Reef Early Learning Centre first met with the Deaf Hub in 2019. They were able to apply for a grant to access training and coaching for educators and children across the service to support communication.

Elise met with centre management and educators to discuss their needs and goals and what options the Hub could provide. Their goal was to build educators understanding of the deaf community and learn how to communicate using Auslan.

"Our journey with Deaf Hub has taught us a lot about inclusion and the changes we can make to support those in our community. Our journey has been a positive one with new skills learnt and new connections made."

Thanks to Ellie and the team these types of programs are now readily available in Bendigo for community groups, schools and organisations and from time to time the team welcomes new volunteers to assist with activities, events and camps. Activities are run in Bendigo and throughout Northern Regional Victoria.

Volunteers will be provided with a free six-week training program in basic Auslan to help ensure your success before assisting with any activities or programs.
